## UPDATES ON EVENTS IN TERM 2 2025

1. We hope that your teen had meaningful and restful March holidays, and you were able to spend quality time with him/her.

At this year's Committee of Supply Debate, MOE announced initiatives to strengthen students' holistic development and maximise their potential. In recent years, MOE has made significant moves to broaden the definitions of merit and encourage holistic development in our students, such as through the PSLE Achievement Level Scoring System, and the introduction of Full Subject-Based Banding to remove streaming in secondary schools. Building on these, MOE will revise the Junior College admission criteria from 2028 (changes to the Polytechnic admission criteria from 2028 had been announced last year). By 2026, ITE will also transit its courses to a three-year curricular structure leading directly to a Higher Nitec certification. ## B. POSB Smart Buddy Programme

3. We are pleased to share that Bowen will be onboarding the POSB Smart Buddy programme for our canteen stalls in Term 2 2025. This digital payment ecosystem is being extended to all schools and once implemented, will enable cashless payments at all our canteen stalls. This will increase the efficiency of our canteen operations and provide greater convenience to all staff and students through additional payment modes (e.g. school smart card, Ezlink card, POSB/DBS ATM cards with NETS contactless logo). The school will be piloting this system in early Term 2, with plans for full implementation by the end of Term 2. More details will be shared via PG in due course.

# C. S4 ITE Level Up Programme

- 4. This programme aims to engage students sitting for the N-Level examinations through exploratory tours and talks on Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) and Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP). There will also be fun and exciting booths for students to try out. The range of engaging and hands-on activities will challenge the students' creativity.
- 5. This programme will be conducted from 1.00pm to 5.00pm at ITE College Central on **Tue 15 Apr.** Students will be dismissed from school at about 5.30pm. One-way transport will be provided for students from school.

## **D. Student Leaders Investiture**

6. Our Student Leaders Appointment Ceremony will take place on **Mon 28 Apr** during school hours. This is an important annual event where the school witnesses the handover between the current and the next Student Leaders Executive Committee. The event will also celebrate the investiture of new Student Councillors, Class Leaders, CCA Leaders, Tech Champions and Peer Support Leaders, who as role models, will lead and serve the school and their fellow Bowenians to the best of their abilities. Parents/guardians of incoming Student Leaders Executive Committee members will receive an invitation to join us for the ceremony via Parents Gateway.



## E. Celebrating Students' Achievements: 43<sup>rd</sup> Speech and Prize Presentation Day

- 7. Our 43<sup>rd</sup> Speech and Prize Presentation Day will be held on Fri 2 May from 4.00pm to 6.30pm in the school hall. It is a key school event where we celebrate our students' academic and co-curricular successes. Prize recipients will need to report to the respective school venues by 3.00pm (More details will be given nearer to the date). Parents/guardians of all 2024 Sec 1 to 3 Prize Recipients will be notified via Parents Gateway.
- 8. Please note that lessons will carry on as usual from 7.30am to 12.30pm. However, there will be no CCA that afternoon. If your teen is involved in the Speech and Prize Presentation Day (e.g. emcees, marching contingent, CCA performers etc.), you will be informed via Parents Gateway.
- 9. To allow Bowenians to experience a formal school event as part their Bowen Experience, all Sec 4 students will be attending Speech Day. This experience, which includes Valedictorians' speeches, also serves to motivate them in preparation for their post-secondary progression. The attire for the event will be <u>full school uniform</u>, with school tie.

## F. Mother Tongue Language Intensive Programme

- 10. The GCE O-Level Mother Tongue Language (MTL) written examinations will take place on **Mon 2 Jun**. To help students prepare for the exams, our MTL department will be conducting an Intensive Revision Programme from **Mon 26 May to Wed 28 May**. The programme will be conducted during curriculum time as well as in the afternoons. Students will be dismissed by 5.00pm during that period.
- 11. Students who are not sitting for the GCE O-Level MTL Examinations are still required to report to school. The school has arranged a customised curriculum for these students, which will be supported by their subject teachers. The schedule will be given to students after their Term Assessment 2.

## G. June Extended Curriculum (JEC)

- 12. To provide additional academic support for our graduating cohort in their crucial year, Sec 4/5 students are required to attend JEC from **Tue 3 Jun to Fri 6 Jun**. Teachers will use the time to help them gear up for the national examinations and final coursework submissions (where applicable). The schedule for the extended curriculum will be given to students by Term 2 Week 10.
- 13. Please note that the attendance is compulsory for all Sec 4/5 students offering subjects mainly at O-Level and N(A)-Level. Sec 4 students offering mainly N(T) subjects may be required to attend consultations by their subject teachers during this period. We seek your understanding and cooperation to refrain from making overseas travel plans during this period, and to monitor your teen's attendance for the extended curriculum.

## H. Health and Road Safety Matters

14. The school continues to prioritise student health and remains vigilant in checking in on student wellbeing. Your support is also crucial towards keeping Bowen a safe environment for students. Please remind your teen to practice good personal hygiene (e.g. washing/sanitising hands) and exercise personal and social responsibility. While mask-wearing is no longer required in a school setting, it remains an effective way to minimise the risk of infectious disease transmission. Students who prefer wearing masks are welcome to continue doing so.



- 15. If your teen is unwell, please ensure he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. Do also inform his/her Form Teachers (FTs). If your teen is recovering from respiratory-related illness, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g. by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions). Social responsibility will be crucial in preventing any infectious disease outbreak in schools. In the event your teen has to miss school, his/her learning will be supported. FTs will assign a buddy to update your teen on lessons and collect his/her learning materials. Please encourage your teen to be proactive in finding out on what he/she has missed from his/her buddy.
- 16. At the same time, we would like to reinforce the need for all students to adhere to traffic regulations when travelling to and from school. We seek parents/guardians' support to remind our students to be aware of their surroundings and follow safe practices such as crossing public roads at correct designated areas. We would also like to take this opportunity to sincerely appeal to all parents/guardians who drive to observe the speed limit, practice safe driving and show graciousness to our staff on duty when in a school zone, for the safety and well-being of our students, staff and other stakeholders.
